The people of Boston -- and of America and England -- bought books on other topics rather than the volume of Phillis Wheatley poems. She was born in West Africa, sold into slavery and transported to Boston when she was 7 or 8, purchased by the Wheatley family, who taught her to read and encouraged her talent for writing. Born around 1753 in Gambia, Africa, Wheatley was captured by slave traders and brought to America in 1761.
